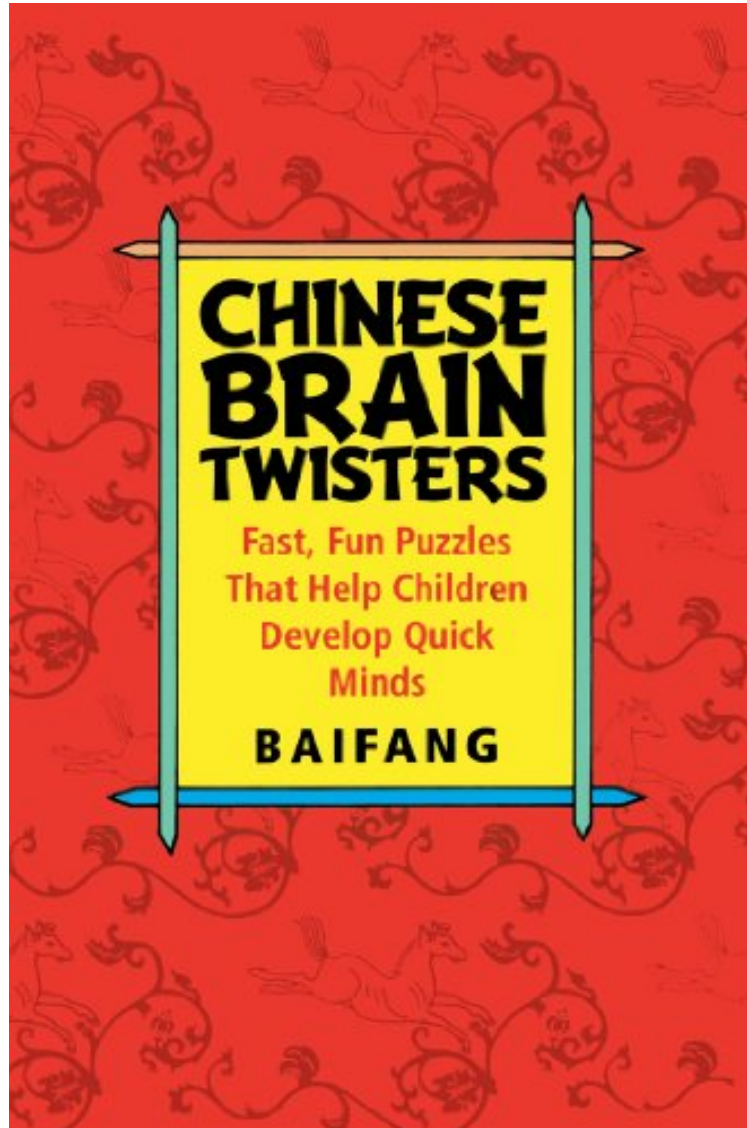

If you are looking for a book which will develop your ability to figure out how to create a new picture using sticks from an existing picture with sticks, this is the book for you. A typical puzzle is how to create two boxes by moving one stick or how to get the dog to face the other direction by moving one stick.
