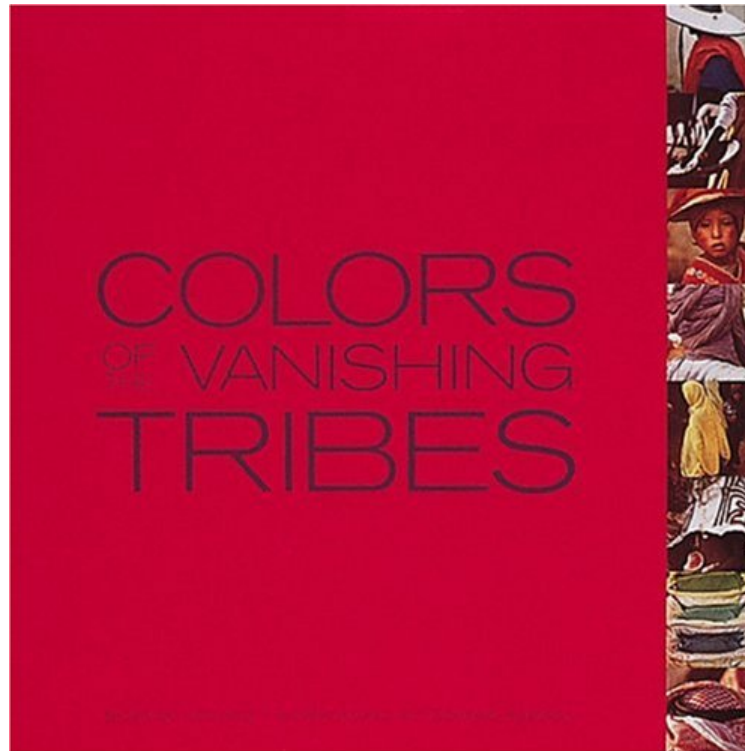

Its a substantially large coffee table addition and the subject is an interesting one (grouping tribes by the colors in their lives). There are some beautiful shots here, but I wasn't overly impressed with the photo quality of the book as a whole. When I compare her photos with other books I've recently seen in this "vanishing tribes genre" it looks a bit amateurish, and I soon realized why that was after I read the celebrity endorsement by Donna Karan inside the cover. The author who took the photos, was commissioned to travel to exotic locations and take inspirational tribal "snap shots" for the fashion house DKNY. While this has got to be one of the coolest jobs on the planet, the (Book) itself was a bit of an afterthought. Donna explains how after years of using her pictures as inspiration for the collections, she encouraged her to publish her travels as a book. Im not saying this isn't a nice addition to the genre, but as a bit of an amateur photographer myself, it just felt unpolished.
