6 of 6 people found the following review helpful. As a repertoire book, not very helpful at all...By Jeffery C. Jones I had some high expectations for this book before I received it. Unfortunately, after opening it and reading the first chapter or so, I was very disappointed and disenchanted with it! It is more like a book with KIA games played with very little attention paid to the opening itself! There are sparse, at best, annotations through the opening, so you have to "assume" the move-orders and any other nuances are correct... Again, it reads more like a "best of" KIA games played! There are a few basic "rules" as it pertains to the opening that are mentioned time and time again, so those are plainly understood "early castling on the King-side in the Sicilian KIA can lead to disaster for Black" but there are really no specific explanations given as to why! You play through the games, read the 1 or 2 sentence annotations that are very sparsely placed in the game and POW you are on your own repertoire book..hardly!! Of course the book is dated @ 1996 but that was not a consideration when purchased; I was wanting a repertoire book to understand and play the KIA..NOT to look through game after game of the opening and still not understand why or how from the moves...All in all I would have given it a "2" but did not to be too harsh, but WOW a repertoire book, really?! 0 of 0 people found the following review helpful.
