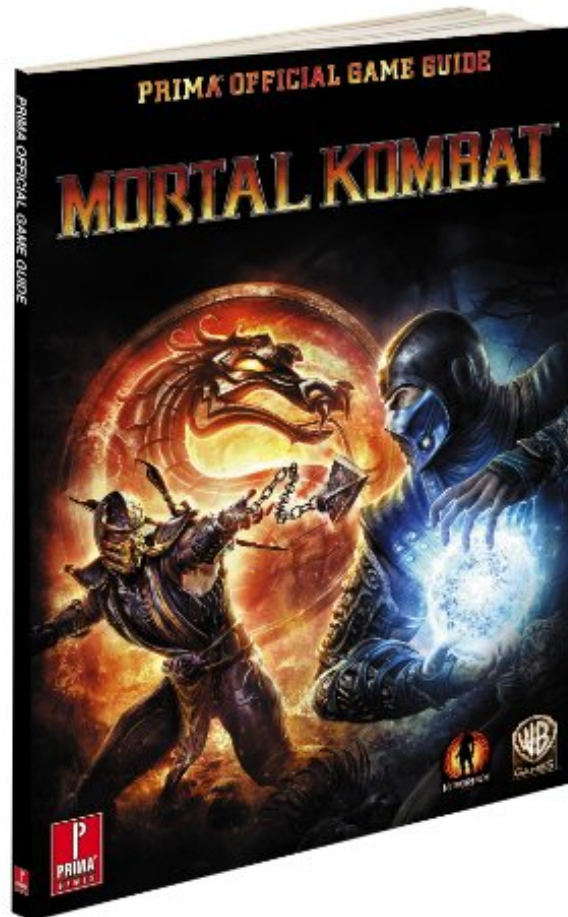

"Mortal Kombat", perhaps fittingly for its topical game then, is an oddball in this regard, devoting the first 20 or so of its pages not to the game it is ostensibly covering, but to a "history" of the Mortal Kombat franchise itself, and oddly, the competitive scene around past games, a topic that might be of interest to some, but certainly wasn't what I purchased this book for. At first I thought this "history" was simply filler, but a name kept cropping up, and I started to get suspicious... and sure enough, "Jason Wilson", who this book lovingly reminds us several times was a past winner of Mortal Kombat game

tournaments, just so happens to be the book's author. And here I thought David Sirlin was the only self-aggrandizing Al Bundy of what we'll laughingly call the "professional gamer" scene! The rest of this guide is workmanlike enough, there are errors here and there but that's just part and parcel of a Prima guide. What still blows my mind about this book is that a dude whose greatest accomplishment was winning a couple of video game tournaments decades ago, got paid to essentially wax poetic about his glorious yesteryears, with a game guide tacked on as an afterthought. That's so impressive in a way that I can't even get mad.
