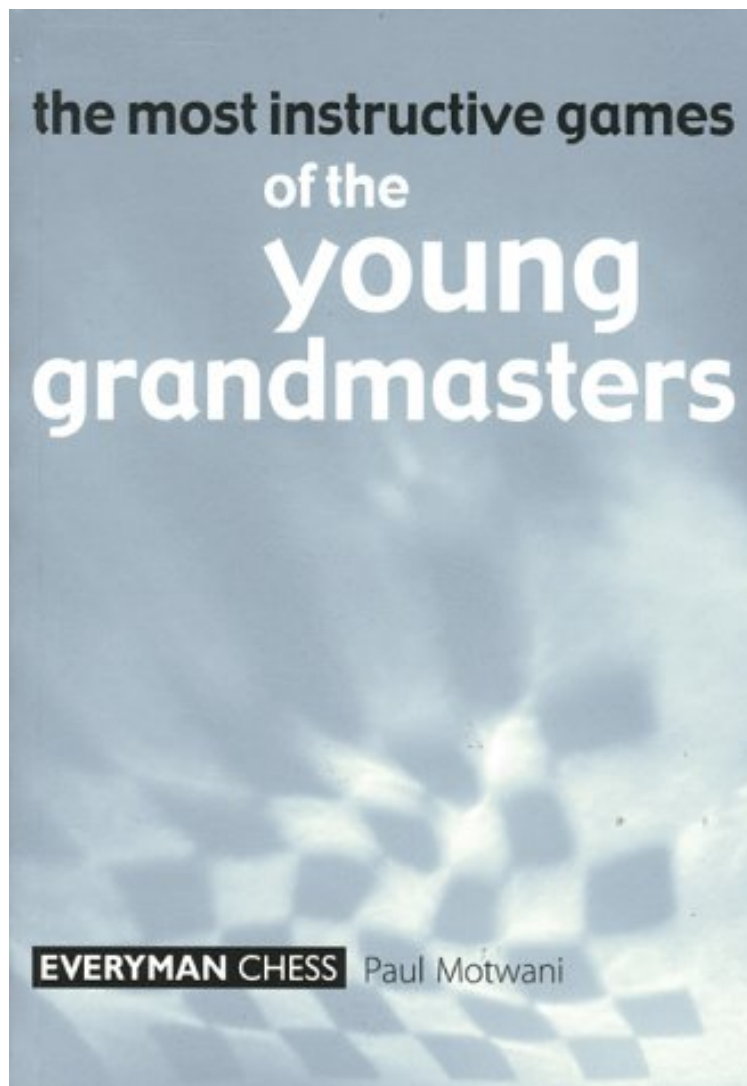

While Motwani has some bizarre tangents in his books, 95% of the book, which is the pure chess material, is first rate. This boom is a collection of very well annotated games by most of the players who are the best in the world in the early 21st century. The annotations are sharp and insightful, and Motwani has a tremendous enthusiasm for chess, which shines through on each page of his works.
