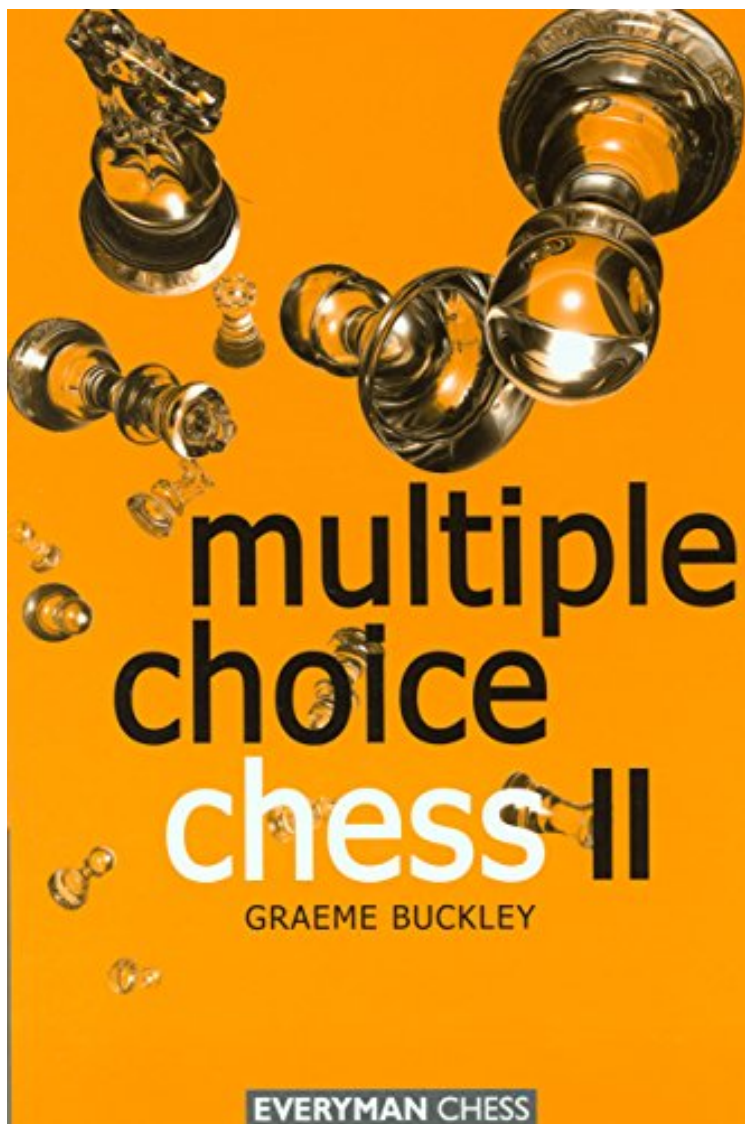

Great instructional games but very silly quizzes By Stefano Tescaro This book is disappointing. It contains 20 very instructional games, but: 1) the format chosen (4 options for

every move, except where there are less legal moves) is too rigid for considering the candidate moves;2) often the author puts silly moves among the choices, and sometimes does not include moves that appears to be valid candidates;3) the winning side moves are ALWAYS granted the highest score. This implies that the winner of the game never made an error and never chose an inferior move, wich, of course, can not be;4) errors and slips of the winner (and also those of the loser) are not pointed by the author.So:- the book has limited validity for testing your chess- it is not adequate as an annotated games collectionFor those willing to test their chess I recommend the book by Zenon Franco Ocampos - Chess Self-Improvement and also the books of Daniel King (Test Your Chess with Daniel King; How Good is Your Chess?).addendum sept. 4, 2006:The single star rating is a mouse slip.My intended rate was between 2 and 3 stars.Sorry but I am not allowed to change the initial rating
