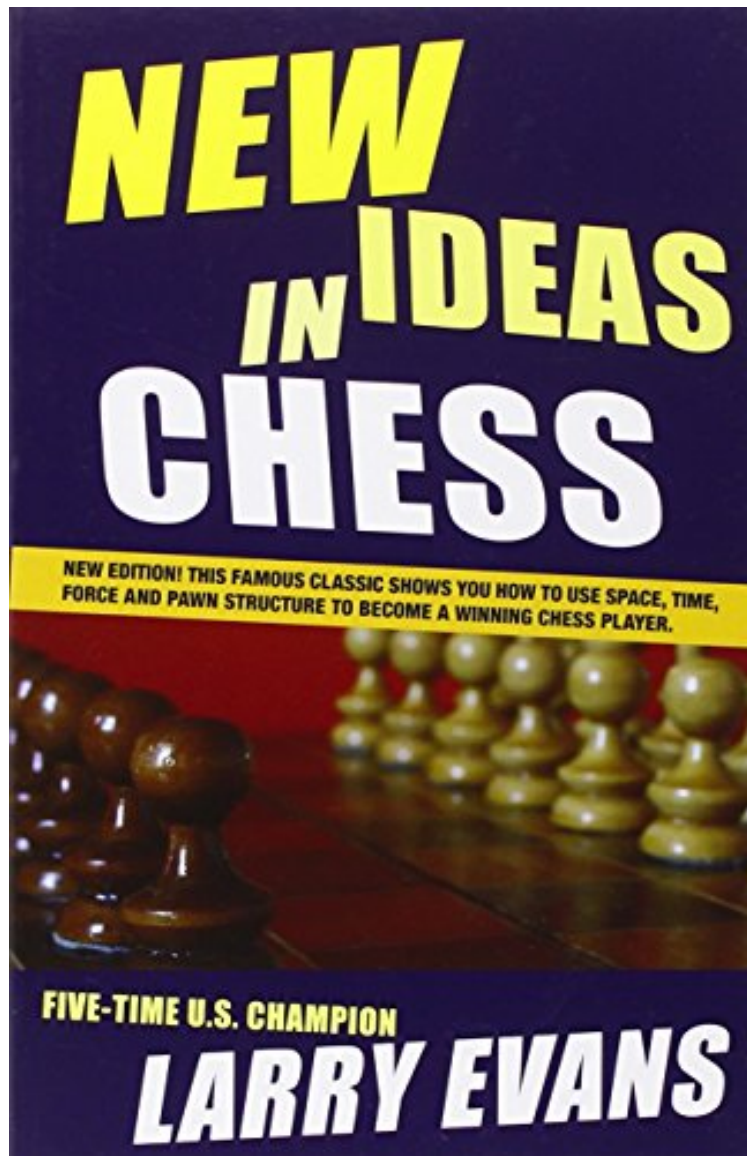

I get the feeling this book was not proofed by a chess player. Chess text and

What makes it only OK is lack of a proofreader. Typos in the print or the diagram are every few pages it seems. I am only partly through the book but a lot of time is spent trying to fathom what the diagram REALLY is or what the print REALLY is trying to say. I don't buy books with that expectation.

In a book that has been called the bible for novice to intermediate players, Evans uses actual game examples to illustrate dozens of chess themes. Each is a mini-lesson that illustrates the fundamental concepts of modern chess theory, ones that can be learned in easy, quick sittings. Evans discusses space (mobility, the center, controlling unoccupied squares, stability.), time (development, gambits, pins, tactics), force (relative values, sacrifices), and pawn structure (passed, connected, isolated and backward pawns), showing players how to weave these concepts together for a stronger and winning chess game. Features 200 diagrams and, for the first time, chess notation in modern algebraic notation making the book accessible to a new generation of chess players who couldnt read the antiquated notation of the original.

About the Author Grandmaster Larry Evans is a 5-time USA champion, author of 25 books, and the dean of American chess. His national syndicated column, Evans on Chess, has appeared continuously since 1971. He coached Bobby Fischer during his world championship run and is generally considered to be the most authoritative, astute and witty observer of the international chess scene.
