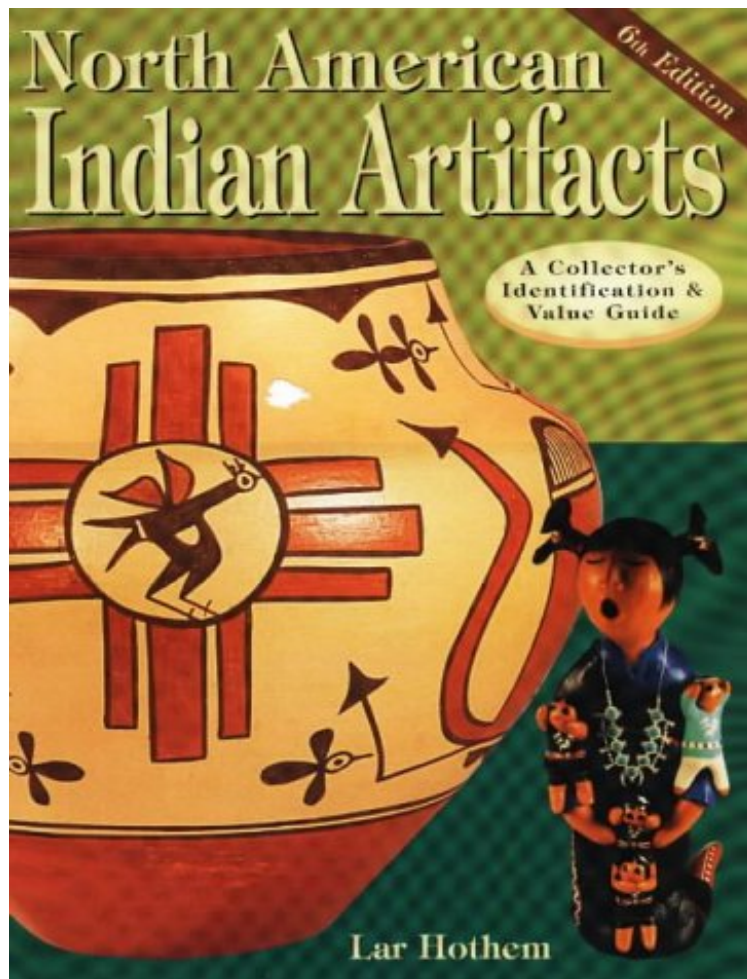

In many ways -- especially when you expand your collection into beads, hardstone (like bannerheads), pottery, to clothing and to jewelry (including contemporary), this is a more meaningful and useful work.
