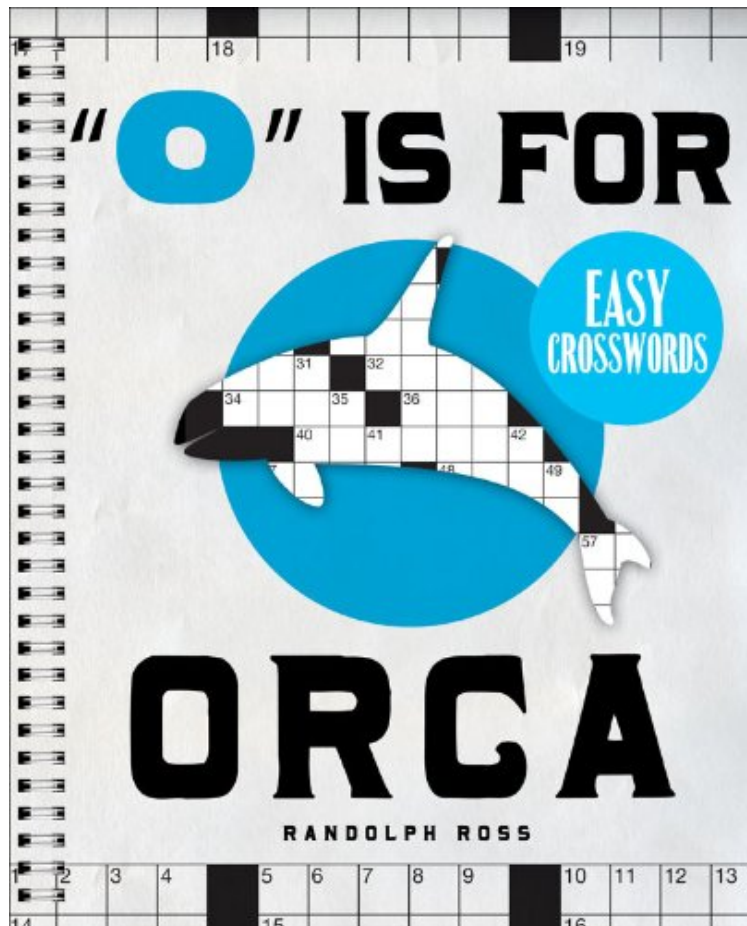

Most of the clues are tailored towards awful, dated movies, plays, and shows that were never popular in any generation. An example clue is "Gary who played Truman", the answer being "Sinise" as in Gary Sinise, most famous for playing Lt. freaking Dan in a little known 1994 movie called Forrest Gump (which by the way won 6 Academy Awards). However the clue was in reference to a 1995 made-for-TV movie called "Truman" in which Gary played, you guessed it, Harry S. Truman.
