In this 27th issue, editors Emily Cox and Henry Rathvon provide crossword variants, an acrostic (anacrostic), quizzes, rebus cartoons, cryptograms, logic, "The Sphinx Page" (riddles and other puzzles in the style of the vintage "patron Saint of Puzzledom" known as "The Sphinx"), a quiz, an interesting coding method called Blissymbolics, and much more from the minds of Howard W. Bergerson, Linda Bosson, Mike Shenk, Gary Disch, Carolyn Van Syckel, Stephanie Spadaccini, E.R. Galli, Don Rubin, Keith N. Richards, Charles A. Duerr, Robert D. Spurrier, Evelyn B. Rosenthal, Dodi Schultz, Virginia C. McCarthy, Merl Reagle, Denys Parsons, B. Upton-Rowley, Henry Hook, Sally Porter, and of course Cox and Rathvon themselves. Don't lay pen or pencil to these virgin pages; instead, scan them and solve them on the scans. Keep this treasure in your collection, unbesmirched.
