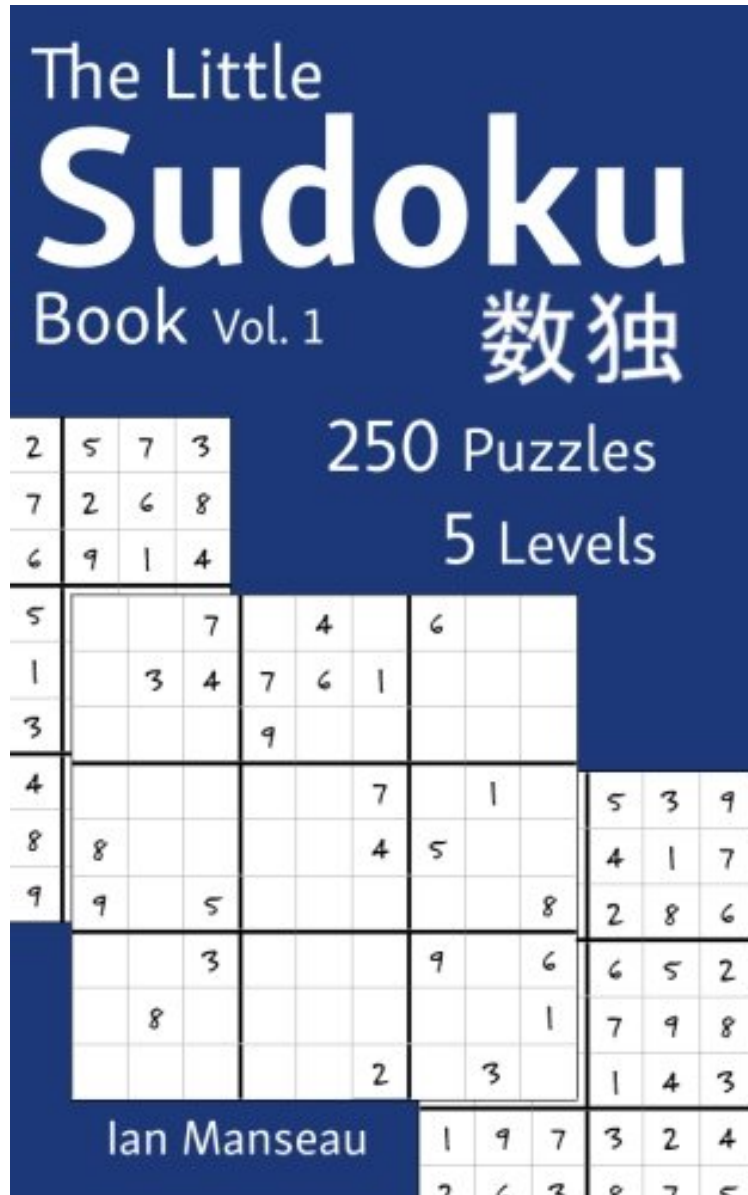

Great little book for the moneyBy cI'll start with the book itself: the build-quality is pretty decent, and I've seen similar quality books go for \$10 or more in brick n' mortar stores. The binding is strong, and you can open it all the way without wrinkling the spine. The cover pages are firmer than most paperbacks, and the glossy finish seems like it might give a bit of resistance to unintentional spills, but there's still enough give to them to let you fold them around the book so you can hold it open with one hand. The lay out of the book isThe puzzles: I'm not much of a Sudoku player, and I've never really been able to get through anything higher than "moderate" puzzles, but I feel like there's a pretty decent progression of difficulty from Easy to Moderate to Hard in this book. The Diabolical and Beyond are absolutely out of my league, but a co-worker of mine who is a Sudoku fiend tells me that he had a lot of fun finishing them for me.Final verdict: I got this book two days ago, and I've already played through a lot of what I can. When I couldn't handle the higher difficulty puzzles, I gave it to my co-worker who couldn't put it down either. It's design is clean and unobtrusive, and the puzzles are fun. Solving these puzzles can take someone a few minutes to a few hours. The puzzle is broken down into 3 different areas; Regions, Rows, Columns each filled with 9 Cells. In any given area (Regions, Rows, Columns) the object is to complete it by placing the numbers 1-9 in each Cell, without repeating any of the numbers.From the Back CoverSudoku in its name only, comes from Japan and is derived from the Japanese characters Su "meaning number" and Doku "meaning single". Despite the Japanese name, this is not the origin. It was created in Switzerland and was introduced to Japan though America.
