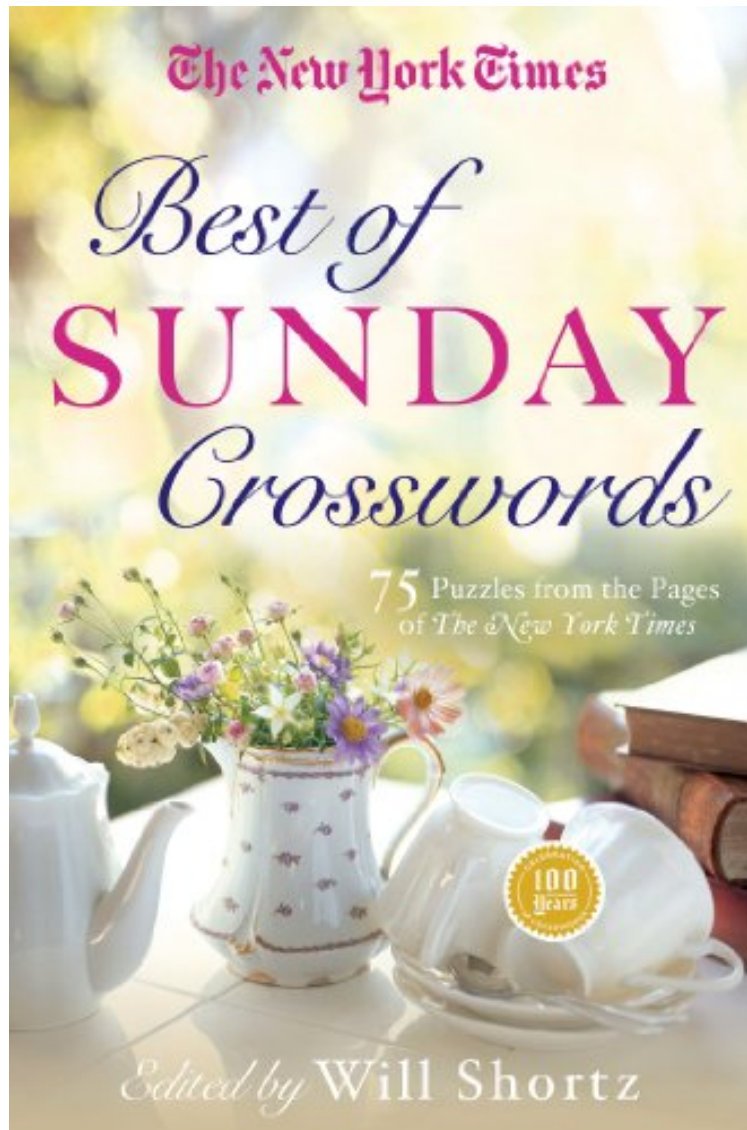

They require, at least for me, more than Sunday to complete, and even then I often cannot quite finish them -- without peeking. They contain lots of pop culture clues, and I simply am not up on pop culture. The puzzles continue to be good -- I seldom have found a typo. So, if you are younger than I, and/or know about what is happening in the world of pop music and movies, you will probably not find these as hard as I do. I still enjoyed solving them. I would rather have them a bit too hard than a bit too easy.
