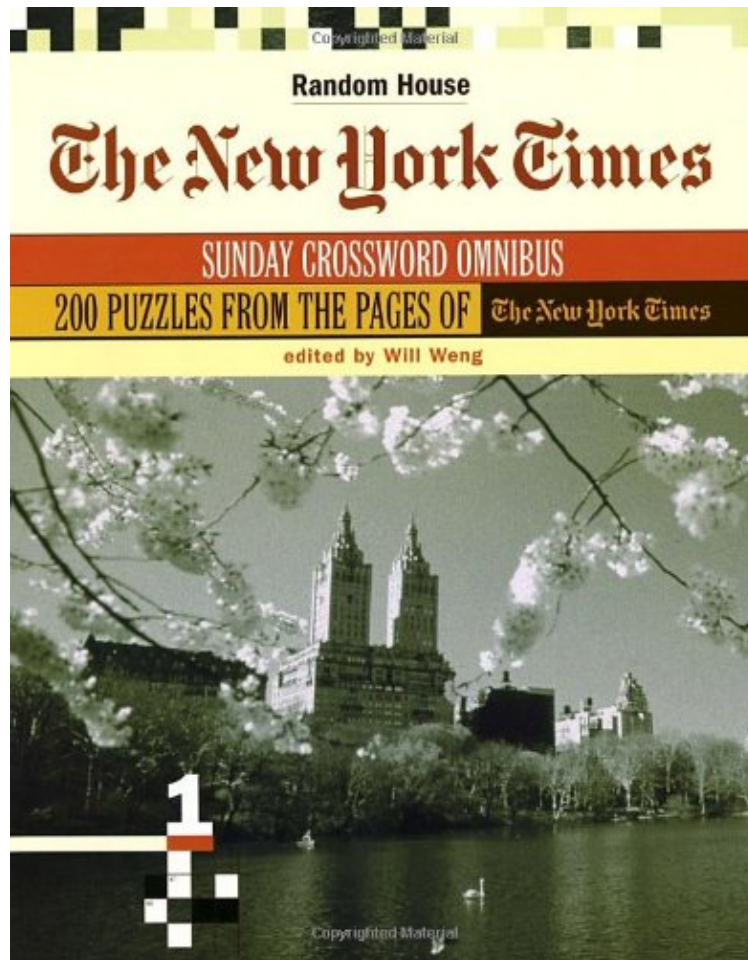

My issue is that most of the puzzles in the book require knowing French, figuring out what creative way they're spelling a common word or the variant spelling of a word from some other foreign language. I'm used to spending a lot of time working to fill in things around a section of a puzzle to find the answers to that section, but for a large number of these I've just ended up with little pieces in little sections and either having to fill in almost everything by looking at the answers or giving up on the puzzle. crossword books are littered with way too many foreign words, places, objects, but this one takes the cake-- and the fun out of it. If it's not foreign words, it is obscure clues for common words, or common clues for obscure words. Maybe if you are a complete crossword nerd, or don't mind looking up most of the clues, this book is great for you. But, I like to be able to finish one correctly once in a while. On the practical side, this book is poorly printed. The paper is cheap and the ink bleeds in it. On the puzzles with 300 or so clues, the boxes, numbers and print are so small, that when they bleed, you can't read it very easily, if at all.
